MNPS Middle College High Accepting Applications

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (March 26, 2009) – MNPS Middle College High is now accepting applications and interviewing students for the 2009-2010 school year. Middle College is looking for motivated students, grades 10 – 12 this fall, who are interested in earning dual high school and college credits. Students attending MNPS Middle College are able to take courses from Nashville State Community College’s entire catalogue. All courses are taught by Nashville State professors and instructors.

Middle College students gain the advantage of having smaller class sizes and the attention of teachers on a more personal level. Middle College teachers and staff serve as academic coaches to students, helping and guiding each child through periods of difficulty and encouraging them through their educational careers. To qualify for Middle College, students must:

- have made a 19 on the ACT. If you haven’t taken the ACT, you can take the COMPASS at NSCC to see if you qualify;
- be mature enough to navigate successfully on an open campus (we don't have bells or hall passes). In other words, you need to be able to be successful with minimal adult supervision; and
- be willing to work hard in an academically rigorous setting.
