MNPS Summer School

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (April 15, 2009) – MNPS 2009 Summer School early registration begins Monday, May 4, and runs through Thursday, May 21. Between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 5:30 p.m., students in grades 1-12 may pre-register for summer school at the MNPS Customer Service Center, 2601 Bransford Avenue.

Thursday, June 4, and Friday, June 5, MNPS will hold open registration. On these dates, 1-12 students may register at the summer school site they wish to attend between 8 a.m. and 5:30 p.m.

First through 12th grade students who miss early registration and open registration may enroll at the summer school site they wish to attend Monday, June 8, from 8 a.m. – 1 p.m. These students will be admitted on a space-available basis.

All students enrolling must have a completed registration form signed by their school counselor and a report card showing the subject(s) failed, along with a MNPS free lunch eligibility form, if applicable.

MNPS 2009 Summer School will be held June 8 – July 2, from 7:45 -11:45 a.m. for elementary and middle schools. The first semester for high school students will be held June 8 – June 26, from 7:30 a.m. – noon. Second semester for high school students will be held June 29 – July 17, from 7:30 a.m. – 12:15 p.m. The following are 2009 Summer School sites:

New this year, MNPS will pilot A+ Virtual Labs at several of the high schools during regular summer school hours. Two schools, Cane Ridge and Stratford, will also offer extended hours for the A+ Virtual Labs (noted above). These virtual learning centers allow students the chance to earn credits in a non-traditional summer school setting and are open to high school students who qualify. Students should check with their school counselors to find out if they qualify and which schools are offering the A+ Virtual Labs.

The 2009 Summer School registration fee is \$50 for MNPS students grades 1-8. The registration fee for high school students is \$50 per semester. For more information, visit www.mnps.org.
