VIRTUAL LEARNING EXPECTATIONS FOR K-8

Twenty (20) hours of core instruction in English/Language Arts (ELA), Math, Science and Social Studies. Within the 20 hours of core instruction, there is a mix of direct instruction (teacher led) and independent practice (teacher guided).

Twenty (20) hours of core instruction in ELA, Math, Science and Social Studies delivered through:

- Twelve (12) hours of live (synchronous) teaching and
- Eight (8) hours of asynchronous teaching supported and designed by MNPS teachers, but independently done by students (at student's own pace).

In-person students typically receive 20 hours of core instruction made up of direct instruction and independent practice using laptops and the Florida Virtual School curriculum delivered through Schoology.

Virtual students typically receive 20 hours of core instruction made up of direct instruction and independent practice using laptops and the Florida Virtual School curriculum delivered through Schoology.

PERSONALIZED LEARNING TIME (PLT)

Students receive 3.5-4 hours of PLT throughout the week. This time is spent in small groups with a teacher or often using web-based interventions, enrichment or language supports such as:

RELATED ARTS

Students receive the equivalent of 1 hour daily related arts instruction (5 hours a week).

Students receive a combination of synchronous and asynchronous related arts lessons equaling 5 hours a week.
